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The power of individual, face-to-face interactions in our work cannot be overstated. When we take time with a client, look them in the eyes, and actively listen, it sends a powerful message: "you are seen, you are heard, you are important, and you matter".

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This personalized approach to case management is a cornerstone of Noah at Central programming. Building strong relationships fosters trust and tailors supportive services to the unique circumstances of each person. Personalized engagement empowers clients and is central to two important developments this Spring.

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Coordinated Access Model (CAM) has returned to Noah!

This vital partnership has relaunched with on-site services on our stage. Our partnership with CAM allows our clients to meet face-to-face with a representative from Wayne Metro to be navigated into shelter. This connection to shelter meets clients' immediate needs with the dignity of a one-on-one, in-person conversation, versus over the phone. The CAM representatives meet with an average of ten Noah clients each day.

New Client-Wellness Partnership with Wayne Mobile Health

Every other week the mobile health unit takes up residence in our parking lot to provide essential medical services, from health screenings to personal counseling. This initiative reduces healthcare barriers for our clients, connecting them upon arrival to comprehensive care to meet their individual needs.

A grandmother of four, Patty has been a Detroit resident as long as she can remember. Her parents moved here from Alabama as part of the Great Migration to provide their family with additional opportunities. Patty shares that her parents instilled in her а compassionate spirit – "if you can help people, you always should", says Patty. When Patty was evicted from her home last year, she was dismayed to learn that the systems meant to support individuals facing difficulties didn't share that same compassion.

Since connecting with Noah, Patty has bonded with our Community Center Assistant, who has walked side-by-side with her through the complex process of reclaiming essential personal documents like her birth certificate, social security card, and state ID. These are not just pieces of paper, but keys that open the door to the possibility of securing permanent housing.

Empowerment is a collaborative effort at Noah. Patty now visits apartment complexes to collect applications, which she brings back to our community center. "I know staff will make time to help me fill them out," says Patty. Moreover, Patty extends this support to her peers by distributing extra application forms while in the community center.

Patty's story is a powerful reminder of the impact of support. At Noah, we don't simply offer assistance; we journey alongside our clients, building lasting relationships that foster independence and selfempowerment, one individual at a time.
